Mission Possible: MEMORIALS everyDAY

TEXT: Joshua 4:1-24

Memorial Day is a time we are intentional about remembering and honoring the men and women that have sacrificially given their lives in military service so that we can be free.

Memorials are also a central aspect of our worship of the Lord Jesus. They are something intended to commemorate & preserve the memory of a person, event, etc.

❖ Some OT Memorials

- Jacob memorialized His encounter & word from God. Gen 28
- Jacob & Laban made a memorial to remind them of the promises made to each other before God. Genesis 31
- Passover was another great memorial. It was instituted the night before Israel left Egypt headed for their Divine Destiny of the Promised Land. Exodus 12:14

❖ His name is a Memorial Exodus 3:14-15

- God said... "I Am" is the memorial He gave to His people for ALL generations.
 - BY MY EVERLASTING NAME Remember ME! That means us today too. In your situation HE still is "I am". Isaiah 7:14

Joshua 4:1-24 – Lessons on MEMORIALS

❖ MEMORIALS are a time of looking back. REMEMBERING What God has done. Joshua 4:7 "These stones are to be a memorial to the people of Israel forever."

- Memorials are ONLY good if you remember WHY they are there. WITHOUT a reason it becomes ritual.
- Reminder of Personal Experience. Joshua 4:6 says... their children would see the stones and ask, "What do these stones mean to you?"
 - We are to TELL OUR STORY. So we will never lose the sense of WONDER of what God has done. What memorials do you have in your life? (places, pictures, mementos)
 - Memorials are a basis of sharing faith. Joshua 4:6-7, 21-23
 - PARENTS: memorials are a way to share faith & the goodness of God with your children.

- ❖ MEMORIALS are a place of RENEWING personal commitment
 - V8-9 While the 12 representatives from each tribe were carrying stones to Canaan's shore, Joshua made a PRIVATE memorial in the middle of the riverbed. It was a personal act of worship.
 - The Jordan supposedly is a very clear river... John Wesley said, this pile of rocks could have been seen from the shore and from a boat of passersby.
 - John Gill said, these are probably the rocks that John the Baptist mentioned in Matthew 3:9, John 1:28 AMP
- ❖ MEMORIALS are a place of LOOKING FORWARD
 - To look forward – To think about what that event, person, or lesson means for TOMORROW. Colossians 2:16-17
 - Because of this event or this person, tomorrow.....
 - Joshua 4:19-20 It was 40 years to the day since Israel left Egypt they, crossed the Jordan and camped in Gilgal which means "the reproach rolled away."
The memorial MARKED a NEW BEGINNING.
 - Our memorials are places we align ourselves with God & boldly decided to step out in FAITH and abandon ourselves to HIM.

Jesus gave us an example and a command in Luke 22:19 to remember HIM. We can make FAMILY Meals a Memorial for our LORD!

- ❖ Fellowship – not just for FUN, but to be reminded of our PURPOSE
- ❖ Communion is a memorial to remember Him
 - One you visit as often as you NEED & as often as you WANT.

Memorials remind us of one more thing. They tell us that the MISSION is POSSIBLE.

- ❖ Memorials remind us of the JOURNEY for our victory and the sacrifices paid along the way.
 - Remember them. And whenever we honor men and women who have sacrificed for us, we need to "I am" tell their stories.
 - Remember Christ – Who provided the ultimate sacrifice.
